

## PROGRAMME CYCLE MANAGEMENT TECHNICAL BRIEF

### Summary

The Programme Cycle Management (PCM) Technical Brief provides an overview of each stage of the PCM process at the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) and the World Food Programme (WFP). It has been developed by the UNHCR-WFP Programme Excellence and Targeting Hub and aims to build an understanding and awareness of these processes to inform joint work, including at the global, regional and country office levels.

The information in the guidance is primarily based on and adapted from the [UNHCR Programme Manuel \(Chapter 4\)](#), the [WFP Country Strategic Planning Manual](#) and other resources referenced in this resource.

Programme Cycle Management is the cyclical process of planning, managing, and monitoring and evaluating programmes. While conceptually the cycle operates in a sequential fashion - *assessment, planning, implementation, monitoring, reporting and evaluation* – in reality certain phases often take place simultaneously (e.g. assessment and implementation) or repeatedly (e.g., monitoring throughout the year, reporting at mid-year and year-end), depending on the situation and operational context.

It is important for any actors involved in joint programming or other initiatives with both UNHCR and WFP to understand the planning cycles of both agencies, to identify opportunities that would allow greater strategic or operational collaboration between the two organizations.

As other agencies and organizations working with UNHCR and WFP have their own specific cycle adapted to their internal processes, it should be noted that operational cycles are not synchronized between partners, and WFP and UNHCR may need to adapt to broader planning cycles and processes (such as national development plans, UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF) and Humanitarian Response Plans).

The table below presents a summary of the key features of the different PCM stages for WFP and UNHCR, with each stage outlined in further detail in the guidance document for each phase.
