

JOINT PROGRAMME EXCELLENCE AND TARGETING HUB



About the Hub

In April 2020, the joint WFP-UNHCR Programme Excellence and Targeting Hub begun activities aimed at bringing together the work of WFP and UNHCR in providing assistance and support to refugees. The Hub aims to facilitate **greater collaboration** between the two agencies at country, regional and global level in thematic areas, and to **build awareness** and support the **operationalization of UNHCR-WFP global frameworks**.

Hub support focuses on joint needs assessments, developing targeting strategies to enable the transition from status to needs-based assistance, data sharing and systems interoperability, strengthening accountability to affected populations, as well as developing joint strategies to promote refugee livelihoods and self-reliance.

The Hub is co-funded by two US government entities, USAID's Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance, and the US Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration (BPRM) with current funding until mid-2021.

Hub support countries to date



Following the receipt of joint Expressions of Interest, the Hub is now in the process of providing support in eight countries. In two countries, **Cameroon** and **Rwanda**, the Hub is providing a full range of thematic support, and in-country **Joint Coordinators** have been recruited for both operations.

In a further six countries, **Algeria**, the **Democratic Republic of Congo**, **Jordan**, **Mauritania**, **Mozambique**, and **Zambia** the Hub is providing modular technical support specific thematic areas. The Hub also supports joint global and regional technical initiatives.

The Hub team

The Hub staff are a team of jointly recruited roving experts who provide **technical support** in different **thematic areas** (shown below), with guidance from both UNHCR and WFP global and regional technical teams. The Hub team works remotely and are **deployable to support country operations** when possible (currently limited due to COVID restrictions). Cameroon and Rwanda have incountry coordinators supported by UNHCR and WFP technical teams in-country.

Hub thematic support in focus: Joint assessments, remote monitoring, and targeting support

The Hub has started providing technical support to UNHCR and WFP country offices on a number of **upcoming joint assessments** in **Cameroon**, **DRC**, **Mozambique**, **Rwanda**, **Mozambique** and **Zambia**. This includes support on the development of the assessment methodology, tools and data analysis.

The Hub is also providing targeting support and has set up a joint **UNHCR-WFP targeting task force in Cameroon**, currently analyzing existing data to inform a targeting strategy for CAR refugees. The Hub will also provide **joint targeting support** in **DRC** (for Burundian, CAR and South Sudanese refugees), and in **Jordan** (non-Syrian refugees), **Mauritania**, **Mozambique**, **Rwanda**, and **Zambia**.

The Hub is also facilitating the development of innovative tools and processes such as **joint remote monitoring collaboration in Cameroon** - to inform efforts in other countries.

UNHCR-WFP collaboration in response to COVID-19

UNHCR-WFP have been working together closely on COVID-19 response and preparedness, including collaboration on **emergency cash distributions** in operations such as Iraq, Lebanon, Mauritania and Uganda, **collaboration on vulnerability assessments** and **targeting** in countries such as Jordan, Libya, Mauritania, Turkey and Zambia.

In addition, the two agencies have been working on **social distancing**, **hand-washing measures** and **awareness raising** for distributions in countries such as Ethiopia, Sudan and Uganda.

UNHCR and WFP have issued Joint Appeals for COVID-19 response in Tindouf, Algeria and conducted **joint emergency food distributions** for the COVID-19 response in Libya. Hub highlights: Resources for enhanced collaboration

The <u>UNHCR-WFP Joint Targeting Guidelines</u> were designed to support UNHCR and WFP country offices to jointly assess and adopt a people-centered, protection-focused, evidence-based approach to targeting inkind and/or cash assistance to meet basic needs in a transparent, accountable and coherent manner. The Hub will co-facilitate an upcoming webinar for UNHCR and WFP staff on the guidelines in November 2020.

The new <u>e-learning section of the WFP VAM Resource Center</u> has training materials available to all partners, including UNHCR staff. This includes online trainings on **Food Security Assessment**, **Minimum Expenditure Baskets**, and **Data Management**. There will be forthcoming courses on **Essential Needs Assessments** and **Targeting and Prioritization**.
